

# Molina in Action: Inland Empire



## Community Champions Awards

Molina Healthcare recognized five heroes in the Inland Empire who embody the spirit of service and volunteerism. As part of Molina's annual Community Champions Awards, each person received a trophy, flowers, and a \$5,000 grant to donate to the organization of their choice. Molina donated grants to Pacific Clinics, The Open Door of Family Assistance Program, Healthy Leaders Thriving Cities, Family Assistance Program, and The Narrow Door on the winners' behalf.



## Partnership with Salvation Army Riverside

Molina Healthcare presented Salvation Army Riverside with a \$50,000 grant to help launch and fund the first year of the organization's First Impressions program. Launching in 2021, the initiative seeks to build positive and empowering relationships with people experiencing homelessness by providing meaningful work and supportive programs and services.



## Feeding Thousands in the Inland Empire

At the start of the pandemic, Molina provided Feeding America Riverside-San Bernardino with a \$25,000 donation that translated to approximately 200,000 meals.

## Van Donation to Community Health Action Network

To support Community Health Action Network (CHAN)'s efforts in the high desert, Molina donated a van to the organization. The vehicle was stocked with necessities for CHAN to distribute to the people and families they serve.

## Supporting Local Seniors

When the weather in Southern California began to reach higher temperatures, Molina Healthcare partnered with the San Bernardino County Aging and Adult Services office to support local seniors. Molina donated new fans to help seniors stay cool and healthy during the heat waves.



## Personal Protective Equipment Donations

Throughout 2020, Molina Healthcare funded nearly \$320,000 worth of personal protective equipment (PPE) for health care professionals and local community-based organizations. Molina supplied more than 35,000 three-ply masks, N95 masks, and antibody test kits to small clinics, skilled nursing facilities, federally qualified health centers, and county health departments.
