Welcome from Plan President, David Nater

Since my last update, our state has endured New Mexico's largest and most devastating fire ever recorded. It will take time to rebuild what New Mexicans have lost, but it is truly inspirational how we have banded together to face this unprecedented situation. In light of this, I wanted to share how Molina Healthcare of New Mexico (Molina) has worked to help fire-relief efforts. Over the past month, MolinaCares volunteers have been on the ground at evacuation sites to provide essential items including food, baby supplies and hygiene products, as well as entertainment and activities for the children and families affected by the wildfires.

We know how hard this time is for many of the members we serve. We are providing ongoing wellness checks and aid to individuals in need. For impacted members, we have implemented many relief actions, including waiving prior authorizations for medical services, allowing emergency refills for medications, and providing coverage for out-of-network services. Molina has also made donations to local nonprofit organizations including the <u>Santa Fe</u> <u>Community Foundation</u> and the <u>All Together New Mexico Fund</u> to assist in massive relief efforts. MolinaCares Donates \$200,000 to New Mexico Wildfire Relief Efforts

In response to the devastating wildfires during this year's fire season, MolinaCares, in collaboration with Molina, donated \$200,000 to Governor Michele Lujan Grisham's <u>All Together New Mexico Fund</u> and the <u>Santa Fe</u> <u>Community Foundation Community Resiliency Fund</u> to provide shelter, food, water and medical care to residents affected by the wildfires.

"We are working tirelessly to provide New Mexicans with immediate relief and recovery efforts during this challenging time," **said David Nater, plan president for MHNM**. "In addition to donations, our field teams are actively reaching out to members, providers, employees and residents to offer needed resources and support."

"Our fire season arrived early due to the extreme drought, affecting so many of our residents and communities with evacuation orders and widespread damage," said Christopher Goett, president and CEO of the Santa Fe Community Foundation. "We are thankful for MolinaCares' swift support in funding relief efforts as fire authorities work to contain the devastation."

In addition to our donation, Molina is actively distributing non-perishable food, water, laundry and cleaning supplies, baby items, clothing, hygiene products and pet food; and Molina employee volunteers are serving meals at designated evacuation centers.

Virtual Panel: Addressing Elevated Social Isola on and Behavioral Health Issues in Seniors

MolinaCares hosted its first virtual panel in New Mexico on April 12, tled Addressing Elevated Social Isola on and Behavioral Health Issues in Seniors. The panel featured keynote remarks from Cabinet Secretary Katrina Hotrum-Lopez of the New Mexico Aging and Long-term Services Department and expert panelists including Anna Sanchez, director of senior affairs for the City of Albuquerque and Lena Ernst, founder and clinical director of Retreat Healthcare. Panelists discussed historical social isola on challenges in New Mexico's senior popula on, the role of the COVID-19 pandemic in eleva ng social isola on and behavioral health issues, and best prac ces to prevent social isola on and address behavioral health issues among seniors.

"It's clear the pandemic brought to light unique challenges our senior community faces when it comes to their behavioral health," **said Plan President David Nater**. "I'm grateful we have dedicated leaders like Ms. Ernst and Ms. Sanchez to help the community navigate the COVID-19 pandemic and whatever the future holds."
